Information for Parents and Students

If you or your family lacks a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence, and is living in any of the following situations:

- Doubled up or sharing the housing of others due to the loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reason
- Living in an emergency or transitional shelter
- Living in motels, trailer parks, or camping due to a lack of alternative accommodations
- Living in vehicles, parks, or other public spaces
- Living in abandoned buildings or substandard housing with no heat, electricity, water, or floors
- Migrant students living in any of the above living situations
- Living in a space that is not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for people (example: garage, woodshed, bus station, etc.)
- Unaccompanied youth not living with a parent or guardian and living in any of the above circumstances (such as couch surfing)

Then your child/children or unaccompanied youth have the right to:

- Immediate enrollment in school without proof of residency, immunization records, school records, or other documents
- Choose between the neighborhood school where you are staying or the school last attended (school of origin) before your transition
- Remain in the school of origin until the end of the school year, even if you move out of the school residency zone
- Receive transportation assistance to and from school of origin
- Receive school services available to other students (TAG, Migrant, ELL, Special Ed, etc.)
- Receive free breakfast, lunch, school supplies, and other services, as available

Resources may be available for you and your family through the Salem-Keizer McKinney-Vento Program. Services available include school supplies, information, and referral to community services.
