

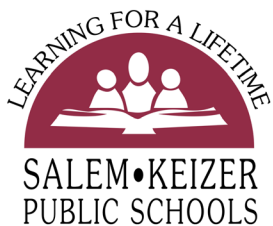

Our Vision: All students graduate and are prepared for a successful life.

Purpose of Today's Meeting: Inform and Answer Questions

- * Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or at most risk of falling behind.
- * Title I is allocated to schools based on the percentage of students receiving free/reduced lunch.
- * Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a schoolwide program. Schools at 75% must be funded.

Salem-Keizer Public School District

In 2021-2022 Salem-Keizer School District will support:

- ❖ 4 Title IA Pre-schools
- ❖ 24 Title IA Elementary Schools
- ❖ 6 Title IA Middle Schools
- ❖ 3 Title IA High Schools
- ❖ 10 Title IA Private Schools

This is approximately **17,416 students**, or **49%** of the total student population in the district.

To be a Schoolwide School:

- The school must have a free/reduced lunch count of at least 40%.
- The school must collect and analyze data that effects student achievement.
- The school must develop a continuous improvement plan and annually review the effectiveness of the plan.

Title IA Schoolwide Program



Claggett Creek MS operates a Title I-A Schoolwide Program. This means:

We use Title I-A funds to serve all students. The purpose of these funds is to generate high levels of academic achievement in core subject areas for all students, especially those students most in need. This is accomplished through:

- * High quality instructional practices: **AVID school-wide**
- * Research based strategies: **Multi-Tiered Systems of Support**
- * Strategies and methods to improve staff quality and to provide professional development: **AVID Digital XP training**
- * Additional Staff: **Community School Outreach Coordinator, Instructional Mentor, Math Teachers & Tutors**

- * We will consistently implement “**writing to learn**” strategies in all classrooms, with an emphasis on all five phases of the focused note taking process

We *EXTEND LEARNING* opportunities *BEYOND THE SCHOOL DAY* through our 21st Century Grant and partnership with United Way...

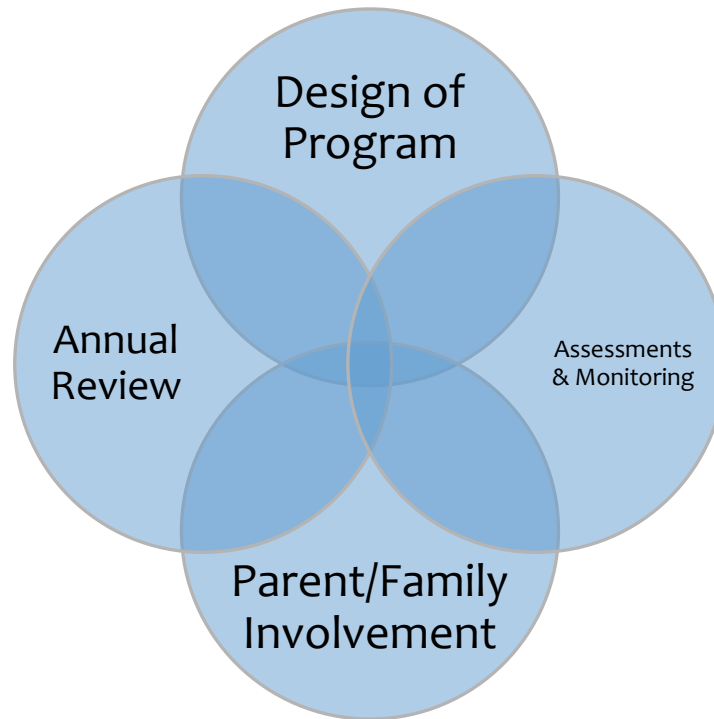
We continue to refine our *AVID ELECTIVE RECRUITMENT, INTERVENTION*, and *RETENTION* to ensure gender and racial equity...

- * Notification of your child's state assessment results
- * SBAC results – *mailed annually*
- * Panorama Social Emotional Learning Survey
